OVERVIEW

Our non-residential Waldorf teacher education program integrates studies in Waldorf pedagogy and child development with philosophical foundation studies in Anthroposophy. Active, hands-on work in artistic areas supports the inner deepening, growth of self-knowledge, and schooling of perception that are essential for the Waldorf teacher. In addition, we also offer other adult enrichment workshops and conferences from time to time. We established ourselves in 2001 to meet the growing need for Waldorf teachers.

- To begin to take GLWI courses, a student must apply to GLWI. To enroll as a master's degree student, an individual must also apply to Mount Mary University. Both graduate and certificate-only students must register for Mount Mary EDU courses through Mount Mary and for GLWI courses directly through GLWI.

GRADES & CHILDHOOD PROGRAMS

The majority of the coursework for the Grades and Early Childhood certificate programs is offered in a 3-year cycle, each consisting of the equivalent of 40 credits of in-person, on-line and independent study coursework. However, for individuals with full-time occupations, a fourth year devoted to the practicum and final project may be desirable. The certificate programs consist of the following:
